 - 6. Number of people paying the tax penalty for not purchasing coverage

Public Coverage

- 1. State public program enrollment
 - 2. Public program churning (% leaving public coverage who re-enroll within 3 months)

Employer-Sponsored Insurance (ESI)

- 1. Percent of employers offering coverage
 - 2. Percent of workforce in firms that offer coverage
 - 3. If employer offers coverage, percent of employees eligible

 - 5. Percent of families with any ESI offer
 - 6. Percent of families offered ESI that take up coverage for all family members
 - 7. Number of employers paying the penalty for not offering coverage

Health Insurance Exchange

Non-Group Coverage

- 1. Number of people purchasing coverage through the exchange
 - 2. Number of people with and without subsidies
 - 3. Percent of nongroup market purchasing through the exchange

Group Coverage

- 1. Number of employers purchasing coverage through the exchange
 - 2. Number of employers receiving tax credit to purchase in exchange
 - 3. Employer exchange take-up rate
 - 4. Number of workers with group coverage in exchange
 - 5. Workers with group coverage in exchange, as percent of exchange-eligible employer coverage
