
#### **Additional National and State Data**

In terms of Incompetent to Stand Trial patients, there does not appear to be a good source of national longitudinal data on number of IST referrals over time, so DSH has to rely on anecdotal reports for informal surveys. Despite these limitations, however, multiple states including Colorado, Idaho, Montana, New York, Hawaii and Maryland are experiencing major increases in IST referrals.<sup>1</sup>

### In general, forensic population growth is a national problem.<sup>2</sup>








## Trend in State Mental Health Agency Controlled Mental Health Spending, FY'81 to FY'14






## Trend in Per Capita State Mental Health Agency Controlled Mental Health Spending, FY'1981 to FY'2014
