

<sup>\*</sup>Medi-Cal non-specialty mental health managed care state costs of \$407 million in 2014-15 and \$529.1 million in 2022-23 and 2023-24 are not included in this graph. Also, not included in the graph are Medi-Cal carved-out psychotropic medications. For reference, psychotropic medications were estimated to be \$1.1 billion in 2017-18. Additionally, No Place Like Home Program actual expenditures of \$304.4 million in 2018-19, \$627.1 million in 2019-20, \$202 million in 2020-21, \$198.3 million in 2021-22, \$578.7 million in 2022-23 and estimated expenditures of \$71,000 in 2023-24 are not included in this graph. Not all Non-Medi-Cal Behavioral Health (Federal Block Grants) are available to counties.
