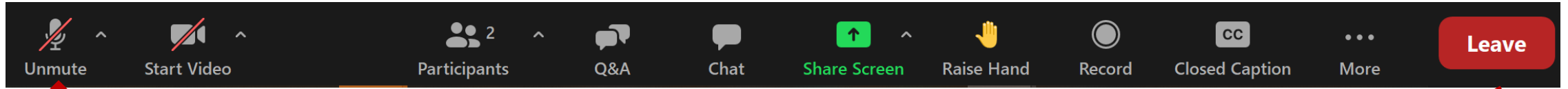

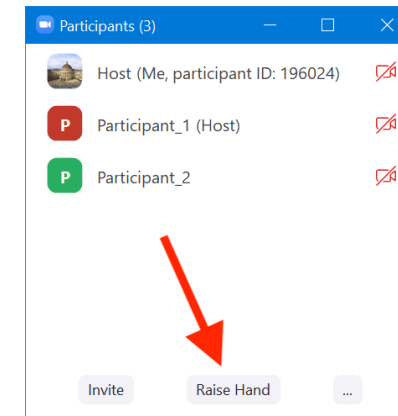

- A plan for the future of Developmental Services to ensure **equitable, accessible, and high-quality** services **for ALL**.

- The committee, **with input from diverse communities**, will develop **priorities, bold goals, and milestones** for the plan.
- Working groups will be created to focus on different goal and priorities. Working groups will be made up of **committee members and other diverse experts from the community**.

Engaging our Community

The State and this Committee will share a commitment to engaging the public throughout this process in many ways:

- Publicly noticed committee meetings where everyone is welcome and invited to contribute to the conversation.
- Public Round Table events across many diverse communities to get broad public input on what is important to you.
- Focus groups to have candid conversations with specific communities and voices of lived experience.
- Ongoing opportunity for public input through our dedicated email address: DSMasterPlan@chhs.ca.gov

Feedback on an Inclusive Process

- How can we create more opportunities for hearing feedback on this process and hearing people's stories?

- Does the name "Master Plan for Developmental Services" send the right message across our diverse communities?

Community Agreements

1. Show respect toward others

- We show respect and assume good intentions from others.

2. Listen for understanding

- We actively listen, acknowledge each other's ideas, and ask questions out of sincere curiosity

3. Create a safe space for difficult conversations

- We establish safe spaces for difficult conversations; we welcome and respect differences in opinions

4. Share time and space for everyone to contribute

- We practice "time-mindfulness", leaving space for others to contribute. We are present and participate in one conversation at a time

Community Agreements

5.Support an inclusive environment

- We embrace and value the diversity of perspectives, cultures, backgrounds, and experiences and center our work in the diverse voices of people with lived and living experience and their families.

6.Embrace collective wisdom

- We are open to possibilities and out-of-the-box thinking, and make informed decisions together.

7.Build Community

- We engage with our communities and bring their voices and ideas to the table

- We work together as a team

Vision for Success Themes

1. All Individuals and their families receive high-quality person-centered disability-related services they need and choose. Listen for understanding .
2. Individuals' and their families' basic needs are met so they can live in the community of their choice.
3. Service systems have “One Door”. They provide the right services at the right time. Services are equitably provided no matter where the individual lives, or who provides or pays for the service.
4. Service systems are transparent, accountable and data driven.
5. The service system has a well-trained, stable workforce with opportunities for career advancement and growth.

- 3. Data and Information Technology:** Information that is usable, accessible, timely, and understandable to improve outcomes, choices, and accountability
- 4. Reimagine Regional Centers:** Cultivating Accountability, Consistency and Quality Services.
- 5. Housing:** equitable access to affordable housing units and resources.

Next Steps on Priorities Discussion

- Committee members and members of the public are invited to reflect on these priorities to prepare for our next conversations.
- Consider how these priorities align with our vision and could inform bold goals for the plan.
- At our next meeting, we will focus our conversation on equity to further inform how we will finalize our priorities and create goals and work groups for the plan.
