



Characteristics of Survey Respondents



California Department

Quality of Life



- High quality of life reported by most respondents (86%).
 - Among people of color: **18%** reported fair or poor quality of life.
 - Among transgender/gender expansive: **22%** reported fair or poor quality of life.
- Example of how across survey domains, challenges are greater for LGBTQIA+ people of color and transgender / gender expansive populations.

Physical, Cognitive, and Mental Health

Physical Health:

- 23% reported physical health as fair or poor.
- 17% are living with HIV.

Mental Health:

- 49% experienced a traumatic event in their lifetime.
- 24% had symptoms consistent with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder.
- 11% reported serious thoughts of suicide in past year.
 - Higher among transgender/gender expansive (16%).

Economic Wellbeing



Financial status and vulnerability:

- 26% reported financial insecurity or concerns.
- **Food security**: One in five respondents worried about having enough money for nutritious meals.

Working past age 67:

- 21% cisgender
- 26% transgender/gender expansive
- 39% Middle Eastern/North African
- 32% Black/African-American

Discrimination and Safety



Widespread discomfort with reporting and disclosures:

- 79% did not report to authorities.
- 30% transgender/gender expansive respondents reported discomfort with first responders knowing gender identity and sex assigned at birth.

Persistent discrimination:

- 27% reported being treated unfairly or discriminated against in the past 12 months.
 - Higher among people of color: 41%
 - Higher among transgender/gender expansive: 49%

Initial Recommendations



- Improve access, inclusivity, and safety of services for LGBTQIA+ older adults to promote healthy aging.
- Increase social and economic support for LGBTQIA+ older adults.
- Understand and address disparities among transgender and gender expansive older adults and older adults of color.
- Measure policy outcomes and improve data collection among LGBTQIA+ older adult communities.

Lessons Learned



- Effective community engagement is critical.
- Collecting detailed and representative data requires careful planning and execution.
- Designing an inclusive survey that reflects the diversity of the LGBTQIA+ community is essential.
- Significant disparities exist within the LGBTQIA+ older adult community, particularly among People of Color and transgender/gender expansive individuals.

Conclusion and Next Steps



- California's LGBTQIA+ communities cannot achieve their potential for healthy aging unless specific disparities and discrimination are addressed across an array of services.
- This initial survey documented areas of need important to conduct survey on a periodic basis going forward.
- Data collection should continue and be more robust.
- Study team is working on finalizing outputs for distribution
 - Focus groups are beginning this month.



- AD-LEAB creates an opportunity to learn directly from the most impacted older adults, people with disabilities, and caregivers about their ability to access services that allow them to age and live with dignity.
- Older adults who are aging at the intersection of multiple identities: race, ethnicity, disability, mental health, gender identity, sexual orientation, language access, low-economic status, and rural or isolated communities are particularly vulnerable because they experience compounded inequities that lead to disparities.
- The AD-LEAB will center the experiences and expertise of the most underserved and underrepresented older adults, adults with disabilities, and caregivers to better inform MPA solutions to address the gaps in systems, programs, and services that further exacerbate inequities for this population.



Framework - Part 1

Goals

- Embed community input through an equity-informed approach with representatives of older adults, people with disabilities and caregivers from underserved and underrepresented communities.
- Deepen understanding of what programs, services, and support systems older adults, people with disabilities and caregivers identify as contributing to living with dignity and care.

Deliverables

- Outreach and recruitment of AD-LEAB members
- Design and facilitation of
 AD-LEAB meetings [at least 3 virtual meetings]
- Facilitate feedback loop and information
 exchange between AD LEAB and EACAD and
 other standing
 committees of the MPA

Tactics

- Learning and reflection on future design and implementation
- Stipends for participation
- Translation and Interpretation
- Caregiver and aid support
- Engage older adult serving programs/agencies to support and nominate

• Framework – Part 2

Problem Statement

Existing MPA stakeholder committees, while diverse, do not currently engage older adults, people with disabilities and caregivers with intersectional identities that reflect the populations in CA experiencing the most challenges to accessing long-term services and support

Focus of Change

Older adults, adults with disabilities and caregivers in CA who disproportionately experience barriers to navigation, access, financing, and workforce resulting in inequities and disparities.

Strategies

Convene - Create an accessible and safe space for underserved and highly impacted older adults, adults with disabilities and caregivers to share their experiences and provide feedback on suggested solutions in the MPA

Person Centered - The AD-LEAB puts in action the commitment to the MPA being a "person centered" approach to solutions and systems

Strategies

Outcomes

Listen, Reflect, Advise -Listen to the experience of older adults, people with disabilities and caregivers; reflect on the learning and advise with equitable solutions •Qualitative data from lived experience on what's working and where there are gaps in the ecosystem for older adults, people with disabilities and caregivers in CA.

•AD-LEAB informed **practices** to address gaps and opportunities in the MPA **that facilitate equity** for disproportionately impacted older and disabled adults.

•MPA solutions and experiences reflect the real experiences and needs of older adults, people with disabilities and caregivers who experience the intersection of compounded inequities that lead to disparities.













- Priority Recruitment Criteria for AD-LEAB Members
 - Individuals at the intersection of identities including:
 - 60+
 - Persons of Color
 - Adults with Disabilities
 - Unpaid family and/or friend caregiver
 - LGBTQ+
 - Residents of rural parts of CA
 - Persons with very low income



- Process for recruitment
 - Nominations from MPA Stakeholder Committees
 - Nominations from older adult serving agencies/programs in priority counties
 - Mandala Change Group interviews nominees that meet criteria
 - EACAD members and CDA will play a role in selection process
 - Mandala Change Group brings proposal of members to EACAD and CDA for approval




