



ARE ENGLISH LEARNERS IN K-12 SCHOOLS⁷ **1,062,290** When the state removes children and youth from their homes – due to abuse, neglect, or other serious threats to well-begin – it assumes parental responsibility via foster care

Children learning English in addition to another language are called English Learners in grades TK-12. California has the highest percentage of English Learner students in the country.⁸

The total population of youth who identify as LGBTQ+ in California is likely higher, as this estimate represents only those students enrolled in traditional public high schools who self-identified as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer/questioning, intersex, asexual, twospirit, or otherwise gender-expansive.

The transition from childhood to adulthood holds promise and possibility. It is also a time when young people require significant supports to ensure their basic needs are met and their voices are heard.






