

## Summary of Breakout Discussion on the Vision Narrative from Meeting #2

The public breakout group had an in-depth discussion about the Vision for Success themes and developed additional recommendations to advance towards finalization. These included:

- Hesitancy around the "One Door" approach discussed previously as it
  may be restrictive and reflect challenges that individuals experience
  with the current RC system.
- The importance of the role of **Early Start** in Master Plan. development.
- A solid workforce with a strong base of service providers and service coordinators that includes accessible language services with adequate compensation to protect stability.
- Efforts towards more **standardized** and **transparent** processes from RCs.
- Reviewing the QIP 90/10 payment structure to extract insights on highquality service delivery.
- Investing in further RC service coordinator **training on IPP drafting** with increased focus on social and emotional goals.
- Further education from service coordinators to Self-Advocates and families on the Lanterman Act and the entitlements it entails.
- Clearly defining "equity" and linking it to accessibility and accountability in an effort to mitigate the issue of high-needs individuals being placed on waivers and not receiving services.
  - Equity should include services that are trauma- and culturallyinformed.
  - Reconsider the expression "right service at the right time" as it may be considered problematic if not constructed through an equity lens.
- A priority of the Master Plan should be the expansion of selfdetermination and making self-directed opportunities more accessible.
- There was concern expressed about the kinds of venues being used for child day care centers.
