Insights Update: Laurie Kappe, i.e. Communications Parental Substance Use

- Challenge Has the National opioid epidemic affected child welfare entries in California?
 - Cannot really answer this question because the available data does not give us the full picture
 - CWS/CMS has a field for entering substance abuse information but it is optional – movement toward dedicated field in the New System
 - CWS/CMS data Not a statewide increase in entries, except in a few rural

- counties
- CA Opioid Overdose Surveillance Dashboard shows the number of overdose deaths by county/zip code
- Other data sources AFCARS, SAMHSA, OSHPD, CA State Inpatient Databases, CalOLMS, Structured Decision Making

- Challenge: Enhance coordination using digital tools (reducing the digital divide)

 - Santa Clara County DFCS moving forward with demonstration project focused on goal-setting/independent living
 - Foster home recruitment/retention

 - Legal Hackathon Desire for more sharing, commitment to making it happen
 - LA County DCFS Visitation and transition planning
 - Open data set for the even for follow-up project discussion
 - Conversations between LA County & CWDS on collaboration on technology efforts
- What is the value added?
 - Data analytics
 - New people are looking at child welfare data through their own lens
 - Technology experts are being informed by child welfare experts
 - What are the types of data we have in CWS/CMS that can be shared publicly via the open data portal so that technology experts can develop helpful applications
 - Unfortunately, a very small subset of data
 - Data management
 - Visitation scheduling using app
 - Making information available
 - Connecting parents, children, resource parents to resources in the community
 - Bring in new information/partnerships

- Engaging youth directly and giving them a voice in their case planning/management
- o Connecting members between care teams/feedback loops
 - Social workers provide referrals to youth via app, then enabling a feedback loop from the referral on what happened
