Recommendations 14-

15

The below recommendations were developed by CYC members at the Summer Leadership and Policy Conference in 2014. These recommendations have been presented to the Child Welfare Council's Supporting Successful Youth Transitions work group on March 4th. The recommendations were a starting point to facilitate discussion on the points CYC members raised.

Housing/Homelessness Relationship w/ ILP Courses Summer Conference

Themes: ILP, Availability, Appropriateness,

-counties should provide transitional housing options that remain in their original region for at least 50% of transition-age youth in that area

-uniform ILP curriculum for youth living in transitional housing

-safety of the transitional housing neighborhoods

-expand THP and THP+ in select counties (or statewide?)

-THP+FC should not be only optional for counties

-interactive, engaging ILP skills workshops; have workers take you to meet landlords, show you how to grocery shop/cook, etc.

-make preparation for independence classes mandatory by age 16



On March 21, 2015 the Bay Area CYC Chapters met for their quarterly regional meeting. The members discussed housing issues in their region of the state. Below is a list of topics Bay area CYC members deemed most prevalent. Top FOUR:

<u>Problem:</u> Not Enough Transitional Housing

<u>Effects:</u> Homelessness, theft and crime, personal health and wellness, hard to find a job, negatively effects education

Needs to be statewide THP consistency Hard to get contracts with landlords/apartment complexes Misunderstanding of foster youth (negative stereotypes) Blaming foster youth for being in their situation Program barriers with apartment leases Landlords don't want to be involved – may be fear of courts, too much work to sign a separate lease with each person who lives in the apartment, or hassle of dealing with the provider

<u>Problem:</u> Not Enough Affordable Housing

<u>Effects:</u> Homelessness, chronic homelessness, trauma, no security, out of financial help, bad in school, not enough shelter beds, constant commuting, PTSD, settling with SSI and Section 8

Long waiting lists Expensive to build Not enough resources Location, location, location Not enough education on housing resources High cost of living

Problem: Not Enough Jobs or Youth Shelters

<u>Effects:</u> Negative outcomes (jail, no college, violence, more abuse, drug addiction), no self respect, hanging with older people, kids become hard, fall into parents habits, limited employment

No funding for shelters ILP skills groups end at 21 Difficult to work enough to support self and go to school No sense of urgency to change Poor foundation growing up Too many temporary jobs or limited employment Transportation Youth want freedom

<u>Problem:</u> Confusion on What's Available <u>Effects:</u> Underutilized services, Lots of questions like "what's AB12, how much is my stipend?" people don't know about AB 12 pros/cons, homelessness, people who could utilize services aren't, lack of a program map

Un-informed social workers Service providers who don't communicate well (foster parents, social workers, lawyers, etc) Not enough \$\$ Too many different groups doing the same thing, not working together Lack of education around self-sufficiency Not enough structured implementation Overall list of housing problems (bold are the top 4)

Not enough housing Transience, homelessness Not enough AB 12 housing (7 votes) Not enough jobs, teen shelters Not enough transitional support Variance among programs Not enough community awareness Not enough affordable housing Rent increases Not enough education about tenant rights Rental assistance program education More education about resources that exist More education and advice around financial literacy More education around leases/credit/rental agreements No clarity on services/no type of program map No help/no subsidies Not much outreach for parents and adults to be AB 12 licensed providers Not having housing in college (6 votes) Not all campuses doing a good job with year round housing Not enough support for housing for community college students Need a co-signer Unprepared Not enough transitional housing Mental disorder Homeless, runaway youth Lack of self esteem Pregnant and parenting Use of drugs Reuniting with family More choices and options Lack of connections
