




Master Plan for Early Care and Learning

A Comprehensive Process for an Actionable Plan





Asking the right questions to make equity a reality.

Access

- Where is the care/support/service provided?
- When is the care/support/service provided?
- Does the availability of care/support/ services align to the needs and preferences of families?

Quality


- Who provides the support/service?
- What are the qualifications or evidence of quality for providers?

Facility

• Are there sufficient and wellmaintained facilities to address needs?

Cost

- Who is eligible for a subsidy?
- What is the level of the subsidy?
- What is the form of subsidy?
- How much does it cost to provide for the level and format of care/support/services envisioned for the system?
