1	Lucy Johns	Thank you. Hello, everybody! I made a number of comments in the Q&A that I hope will be considered eventually. I just want to highlight one about the ability of a patient to opt out of data sharing. Will there be a P&P about this? Did you hear me? Sorry. Okay.
2	Brandon Bullock	Thank you so much. Brain and bullock within the Empire health plan. Just 2 quick comments. We first wanted to express support for draft --the draft language includes in the technical requirements that would require every hospital to send ADTs to at least one QHIO. So IEHP is in strong support of that. Secondly, we also wanted to echo and kind of support comments that were previously made that the QHIO Program criteria should include that the QHIO should be California based mission driven and nonprofit work, and preferably a nonprofit organization. The reason for this is this: We believe that they have demonstrated the ability to
