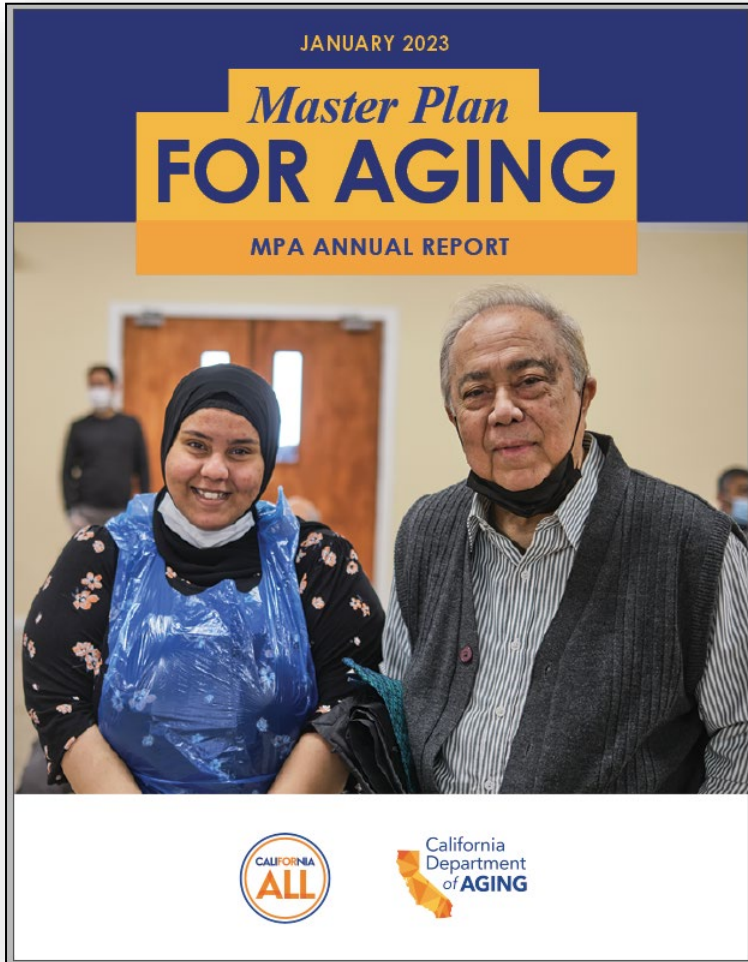

- Invested more than \$20 billion in affordable housing

Building Capacity for Housing and Services and Preventing Homelessness

- Community Care Expansion: \$100.27 million to fund 19 projects to create more residential care options for older adults and people with disabilities

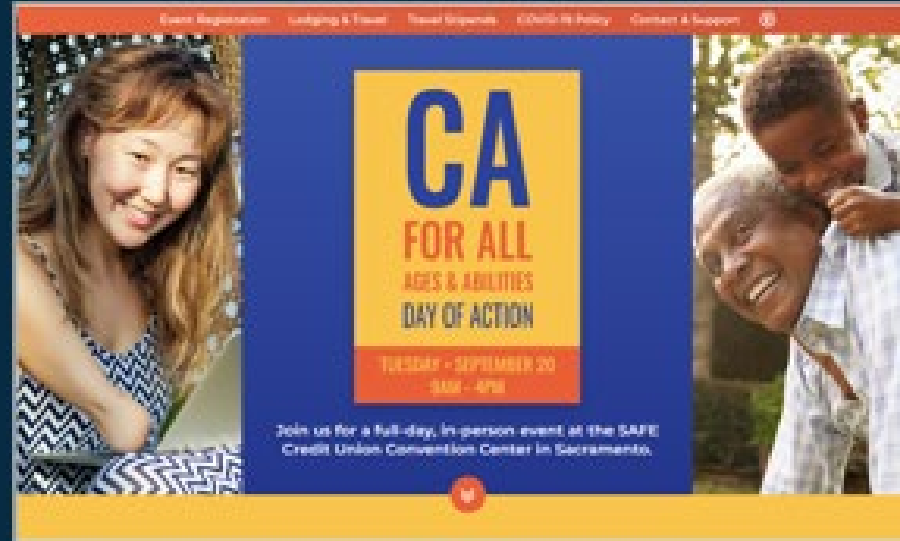
