There was a question related to whether the Committee takes a position on bills. Because the CalHHS Secretary heads up the committee and the committee is advisory in nature, the committee should capture and share their thoughts on bills and budget through the Secretary's memo process. Then it can be taken into consideration as bills move through the legislative process and CalHHS

departments make internal recommendations on bills.

Finalize Recommendations and Items for CalHHS Secretary

Focusing on brain health is important – very important to decrease risk of dementia and also improve general brain health (e.g., brain scans or other biometrics to detect underlying conditions). It would be good to look at the evidence base to determine what guidelines there should be for primary care providers regarding what tests should be administered at different times.

During the presentation on expansion of the Community Health Workers/Promotores (CHW/Ps), one of the presenters discussed that it will be a challenge for most small to medium-sized community-based organizations to become Medi-Cal providers in order to bill for CHW/P services. Ask CalHHS to reduce barriers for small to medium community-based organizations who have established CHW/P programs, especially those serving underserved communities, to receive Medi-Cal funding as they provide these services. One option mentioned was to ensure that large healthcare organizations are partnering with these CBOs, to help bring the CHW/P program to scale.

Recommend that physicians be trained to encourage the person with cognitive health issues to have someone who knows them well attend key medical appointments during the diagnostic process, since one's memory issues may make it difficult to accurately respond to provider questions. There is a need to be careful to ensure that family members aren't trying to exert undue influence on someone with a cognitive impairment.

The Committee appreciated getting an update on the progress and plans for Dementia Care Aware (DCA). The committee expressed concern that the program is currently only funded through March 2024. CalHHS should start thinking about how to maintain and build on the work of DCA, including opportunities to integrate it into ongoing efforts.
