A <u>comprehensive report</u> to be finalized this summer that will synthesize three <u>separate lines of inquiry</u>:

1. Insights from the Research Literature: Proven and promising interventions and systems innovations related to higher education for youth in or exiting secure confinement. This will involve an extensive synthesis of the peer-reviewed and grey literatures.

[Began in September, ongoing through April]

A **comprehensive report** to be finalized this summer that will synthesize three **separate lines of inquiry**:

2. Key Voices from the Field in California: Approximately 50 key informant interviews will be conducted with an array of leaders including teachers, staff at County Offices of Education, Program Leaders, Researchers, Probation Chiefs, DAs, Judges, Behavioral Health Specialists, and DJJ administrators.

[Throughout March and early April]

A <u>comprehensive report</u> to be finalized this summer that will synthesize three <u>separate lines of inquiry</u>:

3. A National Landscape Scan: A national scan for leading models and practices at the intersection of juvenile confinement and higher education
