Universal PreKindergarten: A Strong and Early Start to Inclusive Education

- California State Preschool Program (CSPP) is a critical component of our state-wide effort to ensure UPK for all 4-year-olds and targeted universalism to reach many more 3-year-olds.
- CDE is committed to building upon the current strengths of CSPP and identifying areas of improvement to ensure CSPP is the highquality, effective and inclusive program our children deserve – promoting school readiness, a sense of belonging and healthy development.
- Multiple sessions to gather input and feedback from CSPP contractors, administrators, teachers, family childcare home education network providers, and other interest holders about ways to improve and strengthen CSPP

Overview of CSPP Improvement Process

- Reviewed available data regarding CSPP implementation and potential areas for improvement.
- Identified areas to focus our work on CSPP improvements
- Held a series of focus groups to gather input about our focus areas
- Summarized thoughts, ideas, and suggestions across focus groups
- Worked internally to identify priority recommendations for implementation, develop action plans, and begin to implement improvements.


Enrollment of Three-Year-Olds


CSPP Enrollment of Children with Disabilities

In October 2021:

 Only 4.3% of 3- and 4-year-olds enrolled in CSPP had IEP/IFSP (<4000 children)

Looking Forward:

FY 2022-23 there is currently a 5% set-aside of funded enrollment for children with disabilities, then 7.5% in FY 2023-24, growing to 10% in 2024-25

Dual Language Learners

 Approximately 60% of children under age 5 in California are dual language learners (DLLs).

 As of January 1, 2023 DLLs have enrollment priority within income rankings (after children with disabilities) in CSPP programs.

Bilingual Programs

• Currently, we do not have data on how many/which programs use a bilingual model.

 The Preschool Language Information System (PLIS) will include data on the language(s) used in the classroom by children and staff, as well as information about participation in a Dual Language Program (e.g. Dual Language Immersion, 50/50, or Other). PLIS data will be collected quarterly beginning in 2023.

Focus Groups

- The CDE convened six virtual focus groups with CSPP contractors the week of October 31, 2022.
- Participants helped identify barriers and strategies for CSPP improvements in the five areas listed.
- Across all focus groups combined, there was representation from every region in the state and participants responded to 50 polls and 25 specific questions.
- CDE staff facilitated and synthesized breakout sessions and CDE leads developed summaries for each area following the focus groups.
